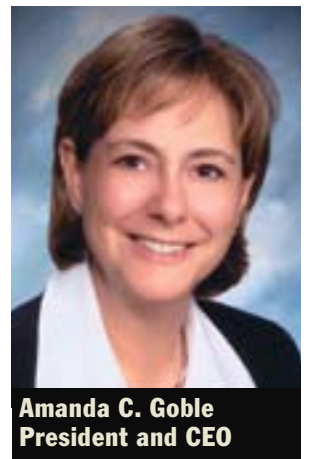

Last year Mary Rutan Hospital maintained a stable position, both financially and clinically, to meet community needs.

We performed well financially while continuing our policy of accepting all patients, regardless of their ability to pay. We provided \$2,834,099 in charity care and made provisions for another \$2,011,852 in bad debt.

We ended 2005 with positive revenues over expenses of \$6,839,340. This net income was attributed to an increase of inpatient revenues to \$33,473,556 and a rise of outpatient revenues to \$72,434,306. This resulted in a 4.8 percent increase on the inpatient side and a 17.4 percent increase on the outpatient side.

Our net patient service revenues were recorded at \$64,647,102, with an increase of 7.3 percent from 2004. We also produced an additional \$3,035,629 in other revenues, with an increase of 36.6 percent for the year.

Operating expenses for 2005 were reported at \$59,701,833, which represented a 3.1 percent increase over the 2004 amount of \$57,904,259. This annual increase is the smallest increase that we have experienced during the past several years and was a contributing factor for our surpassing the budgeted net income for the year.

By producing positive net income amounts, we can continue to reinvest in leading-edge equipment and facilities while providing patients with quality, affordable health care. We are also pleased to provide the Mary Rutan Foundation with funds to continue annual community-related programs.

The hospital performed well financially while continuing to accept all patients, regardless of their ability to pay.

HOSPITAL SEES WIDESPREAD INCREASES IN OUTPATIENT VISITS

Several outpatient service areas have seen large increases over the past five years.

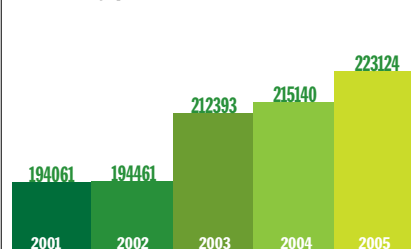
Leading the way are radiology services, which have seen increases in computerized tomography (CT) scans and magnetic resonance imaging (MRIs) of 75 percent and

22 percent respectively.

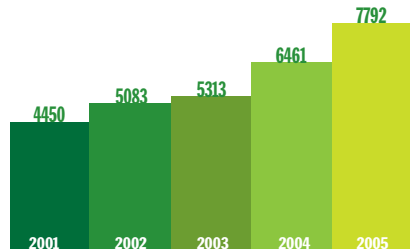
Other standouts include an increase in physical therapy visits of 48 percent and an increase in laboratory testing of 15 percent.

Also, outpatient referrals were up by 14 percent, and emergency department visits were up by 11 percent.

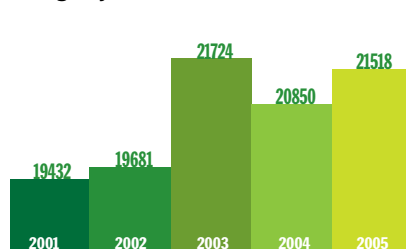
Laboratory procedures: An increase of 15%



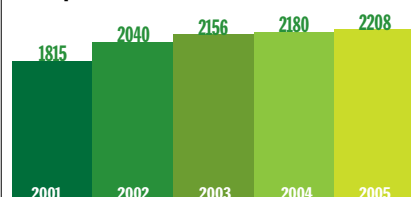
CT scans: An increase of 75%



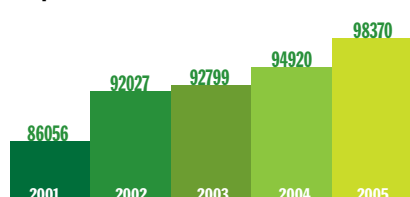
Emergency room visits: An increase of 11%



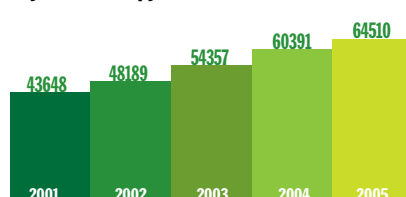
MRIs performed: An increase of 22%

# GIFTS OF TIME AND MONEY IMPROVE HEALTH CARE FOR ALL

In addition to the \$2,834,099 that Mary Rutan Hospital provided in charity care for 2005, nearly half a million dollars was contributed by the Mary Rutan Hospital Foundation to assist or fully fund numerous other community benefits. Some of those community benefits include:

**Call-A-Nurse Program.** This allows area residents to make free calls directly to nurses who can answer their medical questions.

**Kerr Trust Fund.** This fund was established to aid Mary Rutan Hospital patients who are unable to pay their medical bills.

**Medicine Assistance Fund.** This fund provides financial assistance for community members who are unable to purchase their prescription medications.

**Scholarships and loans.** Scholarships are available to Logan County residents who are pursuing careers in the health care field, and loans are made available to students who are attending medical school.

**Healthy Horizons Mobile Classroom.** This mobile classroom provides a dynamic presentation about risk factors stemming from substance abuse, poor nutrition, smoking and alcohol.



**Bike/Scooter Safety Rodeo.** Safety demonstrations and activities for kids ages 3 to 12 are held annually at Rutan Park.

**Logan County Safe Kids Lures Program.** This program teaches children to be aware of people who may be trying to lure them into unsafe situations.

**Bioethics Committee.** Presented to eight area high schools each year, this program addresses medical advance directives.

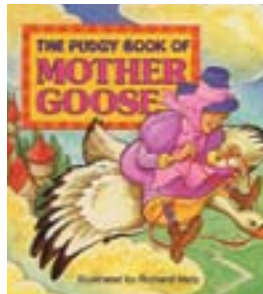
**Mobile health screenings.** Using a mobile health unit, Mary Rutan Hospital provides free screenings at various locations throughout Logan County.

**Heart Partners.** This program provides all area high school freshmen with a lipid screening, blood pressure reading and body mass index reading.

**Books For Infants.** Mother Goose Books are given to parents so they can start reading to their children at a young age.

**\$2 MILLION CAMPAIGN FOR EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT PROJECT KICKS OFF**

**MARY RUTAN HOSPITAL HAS ANNOUNCED A \$2 MILLION CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FOR THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT EXPANSION AND RENOVATION PROJECT.** The campaign, *Together We Can*, is under the leadership of Tom Simon, president and CEO of Hill & Hamilton.

“This campaign is about our community—our friends, family and neighbors. The more health care advancements that take place at Mary Rutan Hospital, the greater the chance that our friends, family and neighbors will receive a quality of health care that saves lives,” Simon says.

Along with Simon, the Campaign Steering Committee includes Chuck Earick, president of Citizens Federal Savings & Loan; Dean Horn, community volunteer; Doug Miller, general manager of Logan County Co-op; and Pat O’Connor, community volunteer.

Sound management alone will not be enough for Mary Rutan Hospital to fulfill its mission to be one of Ohio’s most progressive community hospitals. To be able to install the latest technology, retain and recruit talented staff, provide health care to those who need it—regardless of their ability to pay—and embark on an expansion project of this magnitude, community support is essential.

**In 4 weeks, MRH staff donated \$598,855**

IN SEPTEMBER 2005, Mary Rutan Hospital employees began plans for an internal campaign for the emergency department expansion and renovation project. Under the leadership of Andy Burton, director of laboratory services and the employee division chairman, a committed group of hospital employees came together to set the tone for a successful capital campaign.

Co-chairs for the employee division were volunteer representatives from various hospital departments. These included Janice Atterholt and Kathy Stout, nursing; Jeff Miller, materials management; Al Lucas, food and nutrition; Judy Scanlan, home medical equipment; Frank Aultman, maintenance; Pam McBrien, administration; Dwight Spencer, foundation; and campaign manager Tammy Allison, public relations.

gain or recognition. Today the tradition continues, and three worthy individuals were recognized as this year’s Meritorious Service Award recipients.

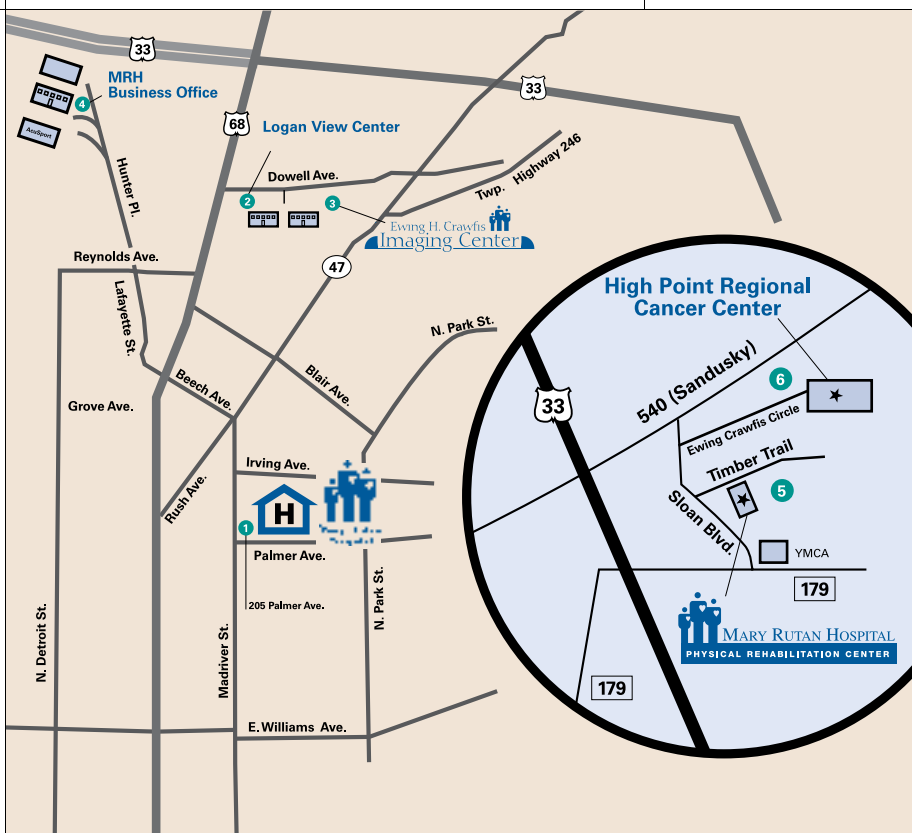
Two lifelong residents of Logan County were selected as the 2006 External Meritorious Service Award recipients.
